KIMBERLEY GIRL-POST SUPPORT

Kimberley Jiyigas has partnered with Goolarri Media in Broome to deliver on-going support to previous Kimberley Girl participants in the East Kimberley.

The development of an after-care model is a key priority and includes a mixture of formal training, professional development and the provision of training and employment opportunities.

The goal is the building of individuals to become lasting ambassadors of Kimberley Girl in their respective communities by strengthening their skills and confidence after the Kimberley Girl experience.



Female Leadership Development Workshops



The 'Ngarranggarni' is known amongst Kimberley Indigenous people to be the time of Creation (the Dreamtime), where all things came into being. Indigenous Australians are a spiritual people, aware of the spirit world, of their ancestors and possess a spiritual connection to land and their 'country'. This reality has been difficult for Governments to understand much less embrace and effectively work within. In addition to this, Indigenous people are familiar with the 'skin group' system, and operate within this framework to determine their social responsibilities and obligations to those around them.

Presently lacking, are sufficient mediators and reconciliatory workers who have adequate understanding of both environments and therefore equipped to bring about restoration and a repair of relationships. This is something that Kimberley Jiyigas believe should be given greater attention to, so that advancement for indigenous people, socially and economically, can take place.
