Late in 2019, Kimberley Birds collaborated with East Kimberley Job Pathways (EKJP) and Vicki McKenna of KAMS to deliver KEHLP in Kununurra. Since launching in 2012, KEHLP has been delivered to hundreds of local Indigenous people with great results. 


