

Funds Raised to Amplify Aboriginal Womens Voices

Through the support of Good Return, Kimberley Birds was able to 'pitch' to a Crowd Funding audience on the development of an Aboriginal Womens Voices Toolkit and raised an incredible \$55 000! WOW! Over the next 12 months, Kimberley Birds will record and release more Podcasts of Aboriginal women, followed by a number of these audios being transcribed, finally culminating into a published book. What incredible support to help promote our First Nations Womens Voices!

'Kaniny Nguurpa' is a Kimberley Aboriginal term meaning that women are the 'bottom people, of no significance or importance'. This project seeks to shine a light on women and amplify their voices, which will be done through written and spoken word. We would also like to sincerely thank Kimberley organisation Aarnja who have recently donated the amount of \$5000 for the same purpose of raising Womens voices. This will be added to our current work of the 'Kimberley Shero' Podcast so more people can hear the stories of our women. We have received some awesome feedback on the podcasts we have released, so we are excited to grow our listener numbers and raise greater awareness of our people and culture.

Following thorough research and conversations with multiple stakeholders, Kimberley Birds has created a variety a resources in the 'No More Humbug!" toolkit to be used by service providers to help shine a greater light on this matter and thereby help to begin to address it through greater education and awareness. 
The 'No More Humbug' project will be formally launched at the KCLS AGM on the 10th December.
