#### Magarda Makers

Our 'Maganda Makers' programs is growing rapidly throughout the Kimberley as more Indigenous women are contacting us to 'talk business!'.

This is an exciting development for us as we feel that economic engagement by our Indigenous community is a real game change for the future and one of the ways to see true self empowerment happening amongst our people. We have supported numerous Indigenous Businesses this past quarter, and we celebrate every win, great or small, with our local women. This pilot project is being guided by a skilled advisory board consisting of Geoff Haerewa, Clare Wood, Cherie Sibosado and Katina Law. This initiative has been enabled through our partnership with Menzies Foundation and Good Return.





#### ADVOCACY IS KEY....

In November, Kimberley Community Legal Service engaged Kimberley Birds to do some consults throughout the East Kimberley to find out how social housing tenants cope with the extreme heat in our region. Policy does not require that social housing properties are built with cooling systems in homes, such as air conditioning. So it was insightful to listen to peoples stories and collect data about how the lack of cooling systems and the living conditions are having a detrimental effect on residents. 
