2024 is looking very different, but very exciting for the club. The club has gone through a transformation, with specific key focus areas identified and now in motion.

Club Connectors have been appointed in our 6 major communities across the Kimberley - Kununurra, Wyndham, Halls Creek, Fitzroy Crossing, Derby, and Broome. The club connectors are local Kimberley Indigenous women who will



run monthly Yarning Circles over coffee & cake. Yarning Circles will be a space where you can share your business adventures, gain support, be updated with club events & opportunities, and be connected to further assistance. Developing opportunities for club members to access pathways to capital funding is one of our priorities and look forward to sharing more about this in the coming weeks. We are working to build the network with the right kind of support so club members have access to partnerships and resources for your business. There are currently 108 members and growing.


