This initiative connects Indigenous businesspeople from throughout the nation, thus providing a network of people that can inspire you, in your business pursuits. The master classes are delivered by experienced facilitators and keep you focused on the fundamentals of business, so you can be informed and purposeful in your business.

We recommend this program to Indigenous people who want to upskill in their business knowledge and take time out of "operations" to reflect on their broader strategy and goals. 

Just recently, we have rolled out our pilot initiative Sugarbag, where Indigenous women have been able to apply for small grants to help them buy supplies for their business etc. A big welcome to Siana Cork our deadly new Program Coordinator of Future Weavers (the broader movement which Maganda Makers sits within) and Olive Knight as our Patron and Mitch Torres, our new Vice Captain.

We acknowledge the many allies who have contributed to funding this initiative, in particular the Paul Ramsay Foundation, who joined us at the Future Weavers Forum in Broome in October.

Please make the time to do some research on Indigenous consultants and/or advisors in your region that may be able to support you execute your plan.

Since outcomes in the Kimberley are so atrocious, it would suggest that Indigenous consultants should never be out of work - and should be continually engaged to give direction to staff who have Indigenous clients.

Reconciliation Action Planc




