# **Job** Pathways

Kimberley Birds signed a contract with Pathways towards the end of last year to develop the Welcome to the Workforce website and its contents. This digital resource is designed to help Job Pathways work more effectively with their Indigenous clients and Kimberley Jobseekers. Now that the project is almost at completion, we will start the training of staff in late May. Using narration videos, activities, and stories - all combined on one platform - the information is brought to Indigenous audiences in a way that's relatable to their experiences of participation in the workforce. It allows Indigenous clients to be supported in a culturally appropriate manner while navigating the transition from welfare back into the workforce. How deadly! Gaining meaningful employment is part of independence and financial freedom so we support those goals!

### VOTE WITH MOB IN MIND


This year, Kimberley Birds entered a partnership with the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC). The purpose of this work is to deliver more resources and information about the political system of Australia to Kimberley Indigenous audiences for the purpose of better engagement. Our work involves creating a Kimberley politics website that is filled with resources that make political education more palatable to mob (ideal for school students!).

Watch out for the release of a deadly new song, and also, we are about to create a mural with local artist, Molly Hunt soon to be started within the Kimberley - so watch out for it. We will also be hosting events that bring awareness of the political system to people across the Kimberley -if you want to be involved, contact us for more information. The purpose of these events is to help Indigenous voters grow in an understanding about what it means to enrol, to vote, their responsibilities once they are enrolled to vote, and WHY having your say matters.

GROWING STRONG IN THE WORKPLACE



As a separate product, but in synergy with the Welcome to the Workforce, Kimberley Birds created a brand new product called - Growing Strong in the Workforce, which is designed specifically for Indigenous staff already in the workplace. This vital resource gives Indigenous staff members the tailored support they need to understand the roles, rights, and responsibilities that come with their employment. The program utilises a narrator who presents essential information and knowledge that every employee needs to do well within their jobs. We know that this knowledge is sometimes lacking in our communities and that this resource gives foundational understanding to Indigenous employees about being in the workforce and what that requires. After a successful pilot in the West Kimberley, we're thrilled to announce that the **Sugarbag Fund**, part of the Tomorrow Fund initiative, is now making its way to the East Kimberley — landing in Kununurra, Wyndham, and Halls Creek with applications opening on **21 May 2025!** 

This small but mighty funding opportunity offers \$250 to support club members with practical items that can make a big difference — from essential tools and supplies to equipment or services that help your business grow.

Here's what some of our West Kimberley recipients had to say:

"I'm incredibly grateful for the Sugarbag Fund that enabled me to purchase a Wi-Fi adapter. This investment is important as I set up my remote work environment — allowing me to reliably connect to online members, access essential work resources, and maintain consistent communications with my team through a stable internet connection. I will also be able to fully participate in other remote opportunities in remote areas, or outside the office. This will not only improve my work efficiency but also expand my access to the benefits of remote work, such as a flexible schedule and reduced commute time. "The funds were used to purchase a high-quality headset which has significantly improved my ability to participate in online meetings.
